FACULTY OF ARTS

FACULTY OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

The Faculty offers a single undergraduate degree: the Bachelor of Environmental Studies through an Honours degree programme. It has three possible variants, each serving somewhat different student needs:

The BES Specialized Honours: For students whose interests are focused within the field of environmental studies, and allows the widest range of other disciplinary and additional thematic courses to be pursued.

The BES Combined Honours (Double Major). For students whose interests link a specific discipline, likely to be social science, humanities, or fine arts to the field of environmental studies.

The BES (Major/Minor). For students who wish to attain a significant depth in one additional discipline, but also to leave themselves significant freedom for academic expression.

SCHULICH SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

The Schulich School of Business is the largest graduate management programme in Canada. Degrees in MBA, INTL MBA, MPA, MBA/LLB are offered on a full-time basis. The MBA or MPA can also be completed on a part-time basis.

A doctoral programme is available in the areas of finance, marketing, operations management, organizational behaviour and industrial relations, and policy.

At the undergraduate level the School also offers a four-year direct entry honours programme in business administration (BBA). The BBA is a full-time programme. Enrolment in the BBA is limited, so the School may not admit all eligible candidates.

FACULTY OF EDUCATION

Concurrent B.Ed. Programme

The Faculty of Education offers the opportunity of working concurrently toward a B.A., B.F.A., B.E.S. or B.Sc., and toward a B.Ed. As well, individuals may enrol in the B.Ed. programme on a consecutive basis following completion of the first academic degree.

In the concurrent programme the candidate takes the teacher- education programme along with regular degree studies. There is, therefore, a good chance to relate theory and practice. Also, by spreading the programme over at least three years, the candidate has ample opportunity to gain practical experience.

Students enrolled at Atkinson College may apply to enter the Faculty of Education B.Ed. concurrent programme leading to teaching certification, subject to the following requirements:

- (i) They must meet the admission standards and fulfil concurrency regulations of the Faculty of Education.
- (ii) If working towards an Ordinary or Honours degree, they must have completed at least four courses, but not more than would allow the Faculty of Education regulations on concurrency to be fulfilled.
- (iii) Because it is a basic assumption of the programme that professional and degree studies will be taken concurrently, applicants must demonstrate a willingness and an ability to complete both degrees (B.A. and B.Ed., or B.Sc. and B.Ed.) within four years of co-registering. To meet the concurrency requirements of the Faculty of Education, candidates must complete no fewer than two academic courses in each calendar year of co-registration.
- (iv) They must be willing and able to fulfil the Faculty of Education requirements of attendance at education classes during daytime, weekly practice teaching assignments through the academic year also during the daytime hours, and the block daytime practicum of from two to four weeks in the April-May period.

The Faculty of Education consecutive programme is completed over one extended academic year following completion of a first academic degree programme.

In this programme, because of the extended year (late August to June) the candidate has ample opportunity to gain practical experience and to relate theory and practice.

Students enrolled at Atkinson College may apply to enter the Faculty of Education B.Ed. consecutive programme leading to teacher certification during their last year of study at Atkinson College.

For complete details regarding admission procedures, regulations and the B.Ed. programme, please consult with the Office of Student Programmes, Faculty of Education. Applicants should note that the remaining portion of their academic programme must be devised in consultation with the Faculty of Education in order to ensure that they meet certification and Education programme requirements. Applicants intending to register in the Faculty of Education at some future date may wish to consult the Faculty of Education for advice regarding their academic programme.

GRADUATE STUDIES

York University's Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) offers thirty-three programmes at the Master's and Doctoral level. In addition to discipline-based programmes in the social sciences, humanities, fine arts and natural sciences, offerings include professional programmes in Administrative Studies, Law, Education, Translation, and Social Work. Interdisciplinary research can be conducted through our innovative graduate programmes in Earth & Space Science, Environmental Studies, Interdisciplinary Studies, and Social & Political Thought.

Some programmes are offered on a part-time basis, and accommodate part-time students by offering courses in the evenings and on weekends. Furthermore, individual study and research is the norm, especially once course work requirements are completed.
